1. Chorus in g minor,measures 24-29,ends on the first note of m.30,after which key changes to G major.The chorus is repeated after "my people doth not consider," mm.46-51.Apparently the intent is to remain in g minor after the repeat of the chorus,for F# is marked in several places thereafter.
2. The lyrics for measures 74-81 changed from "wounds and bruises,and putrifying sores" to "wounds,bruises,and ..." to fit the music:
3. Time change inferred at measure 82.
4. The lyrics for measure 88 changed from "we had been as of Sodom" to "we had been as Sodom" to fit the music.
5. The dissonance in m. 106 ("oppressed") seems intentional.
