1. Measure 5, *Tenor*: first note changed from G# to G.
2. Measure 8, All parts: in original, measure 8 ends with three beats rest, and the next measure begins with three beats rest; all these rests removed.
3. Measure 11, *Bass*: first two notes changed from C-D to E-D.
4. Measure 14, *Counter*: first two notes changed from A-G# to A#-A# (see *Tenor*).
