I have left the words largely as Maunder found them (probably in the 1875 Hymns Ancient and Modern; the tune is stated as being taken 'From "Hymns Ancient and Modern," by permission'); in two places it seemed preferable to use Chandler's original: "mortals" for "brethren" in verse 3, and "Virgin-born" for "holy Son" in the last verse. To restore some of the larger alterations would have done violence to Maunder's word setting.
