

This traditional Scottish tune, arranged by Deodatus Dutton and published in Joshua Leavitt's *The Christian Lyre* (1830), was then rearranged for three voices in Joseph Funk's *A Compilation of Genuine Church Music* (1832) as *Christian Warfare*, after which William Walker re-arranged it for three voices as *Bruce's Address* in his *Southern Harmony* (1835). William Walker added a fourth, Alto part in his *Christian Harmony* (1867). The words above, "written for the Lyre" in 1830, are by Jared Waterbury. The words used by Walker are similar in the first line, but differ in the second and following lines, *Soldiers of the cross, arise / Lo, your Captain*, is by an unknown author in Andrew Brauddus' *Dover Selection of Spiritual Songs* (1828).
