Notes on the Readings of the Source

Mundy's text differs slightly from the Vulgate, which has '*in his secunda*' for '*in hos enim secunda*' in bars 16–17 and '*illo*' for '*eo*' in bars 29–34.

In bar 14 the natural in the Mean has been retained since it is viable, but the evident incorrectness of the other two D naturals in this part (noted below) casts doubt on its authenticity.

16 Mean: ♯ for D

20 Mean: ♯ for D

21–22 Countertenor 2: *potestestatem* for *potestatem*

22–24 all parts: *sederunt* for *sed erunt*

35 Countertenor 1: F is a minim
