
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
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

The text set by Sheppard is taken from the communion service of the 1549 Book of Common Prayer, where it was said by the priest immediately after pronouncing the peace, prior to the reception of the sacraments. The Prayer Book does not stipulate that it could be sung by 'the clerks', but Sheppard's piece may well have been performed in its correct liturgical position. The passage was not retained in later prayer books.
