Polyphony: "Baldwin Partbooks", Oxford, Christ Church, Mus. 979-83 (c. 1575-81)

Chant: *Antiphonarii ad usum Sarum* [...] (Paris, 1519), Temporale, f. 56.

Clefs: G2, C2, C3, C3, [Missing], F3.

Cue-sized and cautionary accidentals are editorial.

Chant sections are editorial and restore the Ponnus (liquescent torculus) at the end of each chant section for *verbum* and *Sancto*.

The missing Tenor part has been reconstructed from the chant source.

Voice-part nomenclature is editorial and uses the Latin forms of English names familiar to Tudor musicians.

Editorial accidentals:

This edition is an attempt to wed verbal syntax with cadential inflection. Leading-note cadences are determined from a linear perspective, and as such, are easily discernible from a single part; signed by return from above immediately before the final syllable of a musical and/or textual phrase. A few 'traditional' mid-phrase leading notes have gone through this approach, even though the clashes they cause are, undoubtedly, an integral component of the style for this repertoire. One or two others have appeared where some may not expect to find them.
